A stream northeast of Chuck Adleman's is causing erosion near the lake on private property. A stream stabilization practice is being considered.

Wildlife and Natural Beauty Committee, Karen Engelbretson

The non-toxic lead exchange is underway with more than 40 split shot selectors exchanged as of July 1. DNR has approved the prepared application for a slow-no wake zone at the northeast corner of the lake along the DNR lowland tamarack wetland. Next step is public hearings.

Bone Lakers Facebook group has 363 members as of 7/9/16. Bone Lake eNews has 320 subscribers. Two Wilkins posters have been created so far: 1) Wilkins infiltration project and 2) 4th of July events.
